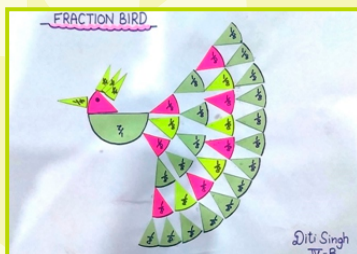
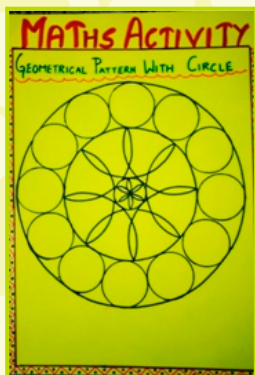

Health & Hygiene



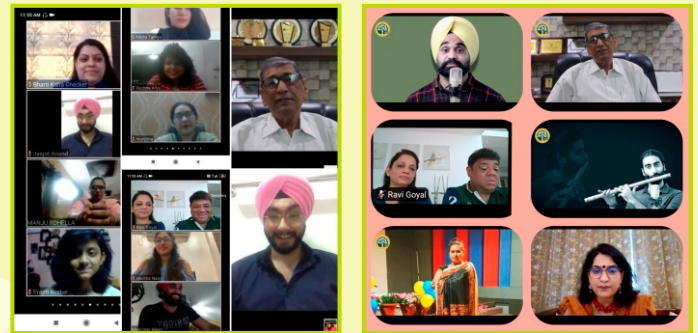

Virtual old Student Association Meet

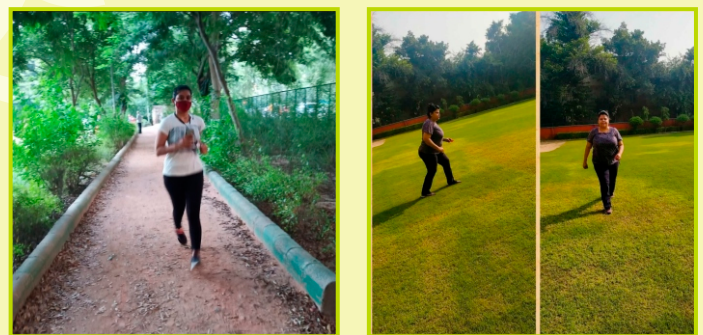


'Memories are the treasures that we keep locked deep within the storehouse of our souls, to keep our hearts warm.
